FORKLIFT (NT)

TLILIC2001 Licence to operate a forklift truck

Are you about to start a career where you will need to operate a forklift truck? Then the law states you must have a High Risk Work Licence.

COURSE OVERVIEW

Forklift operation has been classed as high risk work since 1 September 2010. To undertake this work you need a Licence to Perform High Risk Work.

Forklift truck (Class LF) covers the operation of a powered industrial truck equipped with a mast and an elevating load carriage to which is attached a pair of fork arms or other attachment.

COURSE OUTCOMES

On completion of the course you will be able to:

- Plan work
- Conduct routine checks
- Shift load
- Shut down and secure forklift truck

If successful you will receive a Statement of Attainment.

To receive your High Risk Licence you need to submit your completed application (provided by Civil Train), together with payment (currently \$76*) and all supporting documents to the Territory Business Centre.

COURSE DURATION

Experienced operators – one day (8 hours)
Inexperienced operators – two days (16 hours)

DELIVERY AND ASSESSMENT

This course is delivered and assessed face to face.

Learners will also be sent out a theory guide upon booking which they will be expected to read before course commencement.

There are theory (including calculations) and practical training and assessment components to the course.

LOCATION

Public courses are scheduled frequently in Alice Springs and Darwin.

Alternatively, Civil Train can come to your worksite to deliver Forklift training to a group of employees – please contact the office for a quote.

PERSONAL PROTECTIVE EQUIPMENT

Long pants and a long sleeved shirt, safety boots and hi-vis is required for the practical component of this course. Other sites may have other requirements which will be confirmed at the time of booking. Failure to wear correct PPE may prevent the participant from completing the practical training and/or assessment.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

Entrants will need a level of language and literacy skills to enable them to meet the requirements of the course.

Civil Train recommends year 10 school completion or equivalent as a guide to the level required for short courses.

The applicant must be able to use the English language at a level that is appropriate for the safe use and operation of the particular class of equipment. As an example, the applicant must be able to read and comprehend hazard warning signs, load charts, data plates and any other safe operating requirement. The applicant must be able to communicate this information to the registered assessor.

All aspects of assessment must be conducted in English. Interpreters must not be used during the assessment process.

Learners need to be **18 years of age and over** for licensing requirements of TLILIC2001 Licence to operate a forklift truck.

Learners will be sent a course workbook which **must be read before attending the course.**

You must be a resident of the Northern Territory, or provide a letter from your employer that you are a fly in/fly out worker in the NT, to be able to apply for a High Risk licence in the Northern Territory.

Important information for the one day course: If you are an experienced operator and want to undertake the one day course you will be required to sign a declaration that you have at least 10 hours experience on a forklift. **This course is ASSESSMENT only.** You will not receive any training when you arrive on the day. Learners must read the workbook which will be sent out and complete the pre-assessment questions BEFORE course commencement.

ALL LEARNERS WILL BE REQUIRED TO PROVIDE PHOTOGRAPHIC IDENTIFICATION UPON ARRIVING FOR THEIR COURSE.
