ELEVATED WORK PLATFORM (EWP) ABOVE 11M (NT)

TLILIC2005 Licence to operate a boom type elevating work platform (boom length 11m or more)

Are you in a workplace where you will need to operate a boom lift over 11m? Then the law states you must have a High Risk Work Licence.

COURSE OVERVIEW

For a boom-type EWP, where the boom length exceeds 11 metres, the operator must be licensed. It has been classed as high risk work since 1 September 2010. To undertake this work you need a Licence to Perform High Risk Work.

EWPs are powered mobile plant designed to lift or lower people and equipment to a work location, by means of a telescoping device or articulated device, beyond a base support.

COURSE OUTCOMES

On completion of the course you will be able to:

- Plan work
- Conduct routine checks
- Set up elevating work platform
- Operate elevating work platform
- Shut down and secure elevating work platform

To receive your High Risk Licence you need to submit your completed application (provided by Civil Train), together with payment (currently \$76*) and all supporting documents to the Territory Business Centre.

COURSE DURATION

This course is two days.

DELIVERY AND ASSESSMENT

This course is delivered and assessed face to face.

Learners will also be sent out a theory guide upon booking which they will be expected to read before course commencement.

There are theory (including calculations) and practical training and assessment components to the course.

LOCATION

Public courses are scheduled frequently in Alice Springs and Darwin.

Alternatively, Civil Train can come to your worksite to deliver Forklift training to a group of employees – please contact the office for a quote.

PERSONAL PROTECTIVE EQUIPMENT

Long pants and a long sleeved shirt, safety boots and hi-vis is required for the practical component of this course. Other sites may have other requirements which will be confirmed at the time of booking. Failure to wear correct PPE may prevent the participant from completing the practical training and/or assessment.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

Entrants will need a level of language and literacy skills to enable them to meet the requirements of the course.

Civil Train recommends year 10 school completion or equivalent as a guide to the level required for short courses.

The applicant must be able to use the English language at a level that is appropriate for the safe use and operation of the particular class of equipment. As an example, the applicant must be able to read and comprehend hazard warning signs, load charts, data plates and any other safe operating requirement. The applicant must be able to communicate this information to the registered assessor.

All aspects of assessment must be conducted in English. Interpreters must not be used during the assessment process.

Learners need to be **18 years of age and over** for licensing requirements of TLILIC2005 Licence to operate a boom type elevating work platform (boom length 11m or more).

Learners will be sent a course workbook which **must be read before attending the course.**

You must be a resident of the Northern Territory, or provide a letter from your employer that you are a fly in/fly out worker in the NT, to be able to apply for a High Risk licence in the Northern Territory.

Learners will need to be able to work at height.

ALL LEARNERS WILL BE REQUIRED TO PROVIDE PHOTOGRAPHIC IDENTIFICATION UPON ARRIVING FOR THEIR COURSE.
