Are you in a workplace where you will need to operate a boom lift or scissor lift?

COURSE OVERVIEW

EWPs are powered mobile plant designed to lift or lower people and equipment to a work location, by means of a telescoping device or articulated device, beyond a base support.

This course trains and assesses in the operation of scissor and boom type lifts below the height of 11m.

The 'Yellow Card' is the Elevating Work Platform Association's method of meeting industry needs for EWP training.

COURSE OUTCOMES

On completion of the course you will be able to:

- Plan and prepare for operating an elevating work platform
- Conduct work activities from elevating work platform
- Carry out operator maintenance
- Clean up

If successful you will receive a Statement of Attainment and an EWPA Yellow Card for Scissor and Boom lift classes.

COURSE DURATION

This course is one day.

DELIVERY AND ASSESSMENT

This course is delivered and assessed face to face.

There are theory and practical training and assessment components to the course.

LOCATION

Public courses are scheduled frequently at Civil Train SA offices in Thebarton and Port Augusta.

Learners will need to be able to work at height.
